1:45 PM – 3:15 PM	<p><i>Workshop:</i> Exploring Cyberspace with E-IWO, eTerm & the Debt Inquiry Service</p> <p>During this session you'll learn about the federal Office of Child Support Enforcement's "electrification" of processes that help states and employers communicate effectively including electronic Income Withholding Orders (e-IWO), Debt Inquiry Service (DIS) and electronic terminations (eTerm). e-IWO, DIS and eTerm allow states and employers to exchange information about child support income withholding orders, lumps sum payments and terminations electronically! A description of the processes, how they work and how your company/organization can implement these projects will be presented. You'll also hear from employers that have implemented e-IWO, DIS and eTerm. And there is NO cost to employers to participate in any of the electronic processes. for participating in the e-IWO project. The workshop will also review the revised IWO -- published and available at the end of May -- including changes to the form and instructions. OCSE is also seeking your input on developing a federal employer portal -- eConnect.</p>

3:30 PM – 5:00 PM	<p style="text-align: center;"><i>Workshop:</i> National Medical Support & the Affordable Care Act: What Can Employers Expect?</p> <p>The Affordable Care Act did not change child support regulations. However, because of child support's role in establishing and enforcing medical support for children, there are overlaps between child support and the Affordable Care Act. Much of the overlap is seen in enforcing the terms of a medical support order -- especially via the National Medical Support Notice (NMSN). This session will 1) review child support's role in medical support; 2) discuss the overlaps and differences between child support and the Affordable Care Act; and 3) discuss the most current guidance from the federal OCSE to the State child support programs regarding establishing and enforcing medical support -- all from the employer community's point of view. Time for Q&A -- with child support subject matter experts from the federal, state and private sectors -- will be built into the session.</p>
